The LHMI continues to coordinate coursework with the Center for Hispanic Studies (CHS) at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, MO and with the Crosscultural Ministry Center (CMC) at Concordia University Irvine. We want to ensure that the training offered by LHMI continues to satisfy the entrance requirements for CHS and CMC, and that this training is effectively preparing students for seminary-level studies.



Recently at the request of CHS, the Old Testament, New Testament and Doctrine classes at LHMI have been fine-tuned to better prepare students for organizing Bible studies and writing academic papers.

Three students who recently completed LHMI courses are continuing to pursue credentials from the CHS or the CMC. Please pray for God's blessings upon these servant-hearted ministry workers as they continue to prepare for entering the mission field.

## **IMMIGRATION WEBINAR**

*Did you know?* The best surveys estimate that there are over 11 million immigrants in the U.S. without legal permission to be here. Some groups believe that this number may actually be much larger.

What should we Christians do? On the one hand, our mission is to share Jesus' love and salvation with everyone, whether they have their papers in order or not. On the other hand, the controversies over immigration issues impact our ministries, like it or not.

For the past several months, LHMI director Richard Schlak has been leading workshops on these issues at pastoral conferences and in congregations. # From the Executive Director .....

Last month my wife and I visited our daughter Katherine in England. Her husband is in the air force and has been stationed there for the past three years. It wasn't easy to arrange or pay for this trip—but we were finally able to go see them!

We took advantage of our time in Europe to do a little traveling. We went to Rome for three days and then visited Wittenberg (Germany), where Martin Luther preached and taught, and where the Reformation began. Perhaps you know that this year is the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, when Luther nailed the 95 Theses to the door of the Castle Church.

What a contrast there was between Rome and Wittenberg! Rome impressed us with its extragant luxury; Wittenberg impressed us with its simplicity. The Reformation changed not only theology but practice. Instead of collecting money in indulgence boxes to help wealthy bishops pay their debts, the Reformation collected money in community chests to help the poor.

Hispanic Lutheran congregations in the U.S. are similar to Wittenberg in that regard. They are simple, not extravagant. Generous, not luxurious! Many of our students struggle to make ends meet as they study and work in their churches. None of them are in it for the money—they just want to serve Jesus like Luther did. To share Jesus' love and salvation!
